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MAZDA CONSOLIDATES IMPORTING COMPANIES

Mazda's two United States importing companies, Mazda Motors of America (Central), Inc. including its distributors—Mazda Distributors (West) and Mazda Distributors Great Lakesand Mazda Motors of America (East) Inc. will be consolidated into one operation July 1, it was announced to employees on June 14.

The new company, Mazda Motor of America, Inc. (MMA), wil be responsible for the importation and marketing of Mazda vehicles in all 50 states. Hawaii, which formerly imported cars through Shelley Motors, Inc., will become a part of MMA.

Mazda employees at the corporate offices and all regional offices were informed of the consolidation by a video simulcast concurrent with a press briefing in Detroit.

"Mazda has greatly strengthened its commitment to the American market through this consolidation of operations which will benefit our employees, our dealers and our customers," said Mr. Yoshi Taura, president of Mazda Motor of America, Inc. upon the announcement of MMA.

"This consolidation will establish a new Mazda presence in the United States which is vital to our success in these very competitive and tough times," he added. "Our new organization will require that we adopt a more aggressive attitude in the development and implementation of innovative programs and employee performance. Yesterday's business methods will not guarantee we will accomplish our goals and objectives."

Mazda Motor of America, Inc.'s headquarters' staff, which will be located in MMAC's facility in Irvine, California, will be expanded to reflect increased responsibilities as a result of the consolidation.

"Our responsibilities become even larger, for now the work we perform will impact Mazda dealers and customers nationwide," said Mr. Taura. "This task will not be easy. Challenge, innovation and the New Mazda will be key words for the new company."

MMAE's current headquarters in Jacksonville, Florida will be home to the new company's Southeastern regional office. The Northeastern regional office will remain in Edison, New Jersey.

Other regional offices are located in Irvine, California; Kent, Washington; and Sugar Land, Texas. Mazda Distributors Great Lakes, based in Grand Rapids, Michigan, will remain an independently-owned distributor.

Concurrent with the consolidation of the

importing companies, Mr. Toru Ogawa, chairman of Mazda Central, and Rod E. Hayden, Senior Vice-President and General Manager of Mazda Central, will be leaving the company. Mr. Ogawa is returning to Japan and promoted to a new assignment with Sumitomo Corporation, while Hayden is taking early retirement after some 16 years of service with Mazda.

"These gentlemen have contributed enormously to Mazda's success," said Mr. Taura. "We will miss their guidance and direction, however, they have left us a legacy upon which we can build for the future."

Mr. Keiji Asano, a senior managing director of Mazda Motor Corporation will be the new company's chairman. He will be based in Japan.

Several new positions are being formed with the new company. Filling these spots will be George McCabe, formerly with MMAE, as Group Vice President-Deputy General Manager, Marketing and Sales and J.R. Seidel, formerly Vice President-Operations at Mazda's Gulf Region, who will become Group Vice President-Deputy General Manager, Operations for MMA.

RETURN TO JAPAN

Mazda Central Chairman Mr. Toru Ogawa, Mazda Central's top executive since 1976, will return to Japan as Managing Director, Motor Vehicle Division, Sumitomo Corporation, effec-

Mr. Ogawa first joined Mazda Central on January 1, 1976, when he was appointed president. He accompanied MMAC on their move from Chicago to southern California in 1978, and was named chairman in 1987.

Mr. Ogawa graduated from Tokyo University in 1955, and joined Sumitomo Shoji, Ltd. that

Rod E. Hayden, Senior Vice-President and General Manager of Mazda Motors of America (Central), Inc., has announced his retirement from the company, effective June 30. He is retiring to pursue outside interests, including his favorite pastime, golf.

Hayden joined Mazda in July 1972 as midwestern sales manager for Mazda Motors of America, Inc., the predecessor of Mazda Central. Prior to joining Mazda, Hayden was a

Sales have increased steadily during his years at Mazda, and with the consolidation of the two Mazda importing companies, a major goal in his career has been attained.

MAZDA OPENS NEW R&D CENTER

Mazda (North America), Inc. (MANA) officially opened its new Research and Development Center May 19 with an open house and ribbon cutting ceremony. The R&D Center is located adjacent to MANA headquarters in Irvine, California.



The facility, completed in March 1988, houses Mazda's Advanced Product Development and Research and Testing divisions. The \$23 million, two-story R&D Center expands the scope of Mazda's worldwide research and development efforts, particularly in the areas of design and application of new automotive technologies.

"Many technological innovations and design trends have been born here in Southern California," said Kenichi Yamamoto, chairman of Mazda Motor Corporation, while speaking to the open house gathering. "We believe this center will not only help Mazda create distinctive vehicles that Americans will enjoy and love, but that it also will be a place where ideas and cars that are ahead of their time are created."


The center is part of an overall expansion of Mazda research and development facilities in the U.S., Europe and Japan.

Design and development work conducted in Irvine, in conjunction with similar efforts at Mazda's R&D centers in Japan, will be incorporated into products produced by Mazda Motor Manufacturing (USA), Corp. (MMUC) in Flat Rock, Michigan.

"Over the years, Mazda has earned a reputation for meeting the demands of the market-place with innovative research and technology," said Hisao Kaide, president of Mazda (North America), Inc. "The staff located here is committed to developing unique and attractive products to meet the demands of our customers."

The Mazda Research and Development Center sits on 4.2 acres, with a total floor space of 126,170 square feet. Plans call for total employment of some 60–70 people.

MANA is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Mazda Motor Corp., and operates facilities in Flat Rock and Ann Arbor Township, Mich.; Jacksonville, Fla., and San Juan, Puerto Rico.



MANA is responsible for research and development, accessory development, air-conditioning assembly, distribution of MMUC-built vehicles to Mazda Motors of America companies as well as providing support to service, marketing and public relations.

MIDLOTHIAN PROCESSES 250,000TH MAZDA

Mazda's Inland Port at Midlothian, Texas celebrated the processing of its 250,000th vehicle on May 19 with an open house celebration.

The 250,000th unit, a 1988 MX-6 LX from the Mazda Motor Manufacturing (USA) Corp. plant in Flat Rock, Michigan, was processed five years and four months after originally opening for business on January 1, 1983.

From an original design of 30 acres, 45 employees and 24,000 vehicles processed per year, the Midlothian Inland Port now covers 54 acres, employs 121 people, and is capable of processing more than 72,000 vehicles per year.

Midlothian is the inland port of entry for the processing and shipment of Mazda vehicles to dealers in an eight state area. Those states are Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Mississippi, Tennessee, Kentucky and parts of Missouri.


GREAT LAKES ACTIVITIES

Mazda Great Lakes recently said goodbye to



NEW R&D COMPANY FORMED

Mazda has taken a big step toward responding quickly to changes in the U.S. market by announcing the formation of Mazda Research and Development of North America, Inc.

This new company will be headquartered in Irvine, California, in a newly dedicated \$23 million facility which will serve as Mazda's North American design center. The Irvine location also will have responsibility for product planning, advanced product development and evaluation testing, and vehicle certification procedures.

The new company's Ann Arbor Township, Michigan facility, a \$7.8 million investment which was dedicated in April 1987, will engage in the development of new technology and interface with the U.S Environmental Protection Agency facility located there. A Washington, D.C. office will be responsible for U.S. patent matters, while the company's Flat Rock, Michigan operation will be involved in parts and accessory development and the search for U.S. sourcing of parts and equipment.

Hisao Kaide, current president of Mazda (North America), Inc. (MANA), will be chairman of both MANA and MRDNA. Hiroshi Moriyoshi has been named president of the new company, which will be officially established on July 1, while Muneo Kishimoto will become president of MANA.

JOLLY, JOHNSON POST IMSA SEDAN WINS

Defending Camel Light champion Jim Downing is also holding tough in his Mazdapowered Argo. Downing is currently tied for third in the IMSA Camel Light points standing.
